#### **TACRAO 2024 Reflection**

For those of you who were able to join us in San Marcos this year, I hope you had a wonderful time filled with learning and fellowship. If you were unable to join us this year, please see the session highlights below that demonstrate why you should definitely join us next year.

#### Session Ratings

Our TACRAO attendees submitted just shy of 800 session evaluations. Admissions and Registrar folks can be known to have very strong opinions; however, highly positive ratings were submitted along with highly positive praise for our session presenters. On a 1-5 scale, we had over a 4.5 average rating for each individual category (visual aids, timely and relevant, adequate seating, session followed program summary, and would recommend session) and that's truly amazing.

There were too many wonderful sessions to include everyone in this highlight reel. However, I will provide a few specific VP of Records and Registration Committee session highlights:

- <u>Records and Registration Track</u>: Office of the Registrar Career Ladders showed attendees how Tarleton State University created career ladders to improve staff retention and benefit students.
- Graduation & Commencement Track: Accessibility Matters at Commencement discussed the Americans with Disabilities Act and the importance of providing the correct atmosphere for all graduating students and guests.
- Management, Organization, and Professional Development Track: Starving the Imposter: A Guide for Mentoring New and Aspiring Leaders helped attendees get ideas to grow themselves and others at their institutions.
- <u>Technology and Data Collection Track</u>: Attendees learned how to manage their life and time a bit better with sessions like *Microsoft TEAMS: Tips and Tricks* and *I Want My Life Back! Taming the Outlook Monster*.
- <u>Certification and Legal Issues Track:</u> Sessions like Applying FERPA in Real Life


#### **2024 Resolutions Report**


